Part 1 of 6: Africa's exploding birthrates, water shortages, food scarcity, animal extinctions

As immigration, both legal and illegal, continues flooding into the United States of America—it also pours into Canada, Australia and Europe. Note that all Western countries stabilized their populations since 1970 by averaging 2.0 children or less per female.

Unfortunately, as first world countries created stable and sustainable societies since 1970, their leaders chose unending immigration from overloaded developing countries. For the United States, the late Senator Teddy Kennedy created the 1965 Immigration Reform Act that added 100 million people to America by October of 2006. If continued, that same act expects to add another 100 million people within 32 years by 2050. Much the same immigrant ingress occurs in Canada, Europe and Australia. Where do those immigrants originate? Answer: the developing countries that adds 80 million, net gain, annually.

Unknown to most countries and people living on this planet, an accelerating birthrate in Africa threatens all Western civilizations in the 21st century. At 1.1 billion in 2018, Africa accelerates toward 2.1 billion by 2050 and 4 billion by the end of this century. (Source: "Africa's Population Projections" by United Nations 2016)

As an example, the average Burundian woman births 6.3 children, double the international fertility rate. Burundians expect to jump from 10 million to 20 million in a few decades. Egypt, currently 85 million, expects to reach 105 million by 2030. Ethiopia, at 98 million, expects to double to 210 million by 2060. (Source: UN "Africa's Population Projections")

Ironically, Egypt imports most of its food to feed its current population in 2018. As the human race adds 1 billion more people, net gain, every 12 years, Africa expects to quadruple its population within 82 years. Africans grow so fast; they cannot water, feed, house, educate or sustain the expected 4 billion people about to land on that continent.

What does it mean? It means that every living creature featuring feathers, hooves, claws, fins or fur that lives in Africa will become

food for the human mob. It means relentless extinction of rhinos, lions, gazelles, wildebeest, giraffes and elephants—just about any creature that breathes.

Nonetheless, the Pope condemns birth control in Africa. Islam promotes as many children as possible as it expands across the globe by birthrate and/or jihad. World leaders see the carnage, poverty, disease and futility of Africa in 2018, but fail to call for a world conference to discuss what's coming and what can be done to change course.

Therefore, those burgeoning populations flood into first world countries with no end to the line.

In other words, the line never ends as Mexico remains on course to add another 20 million people by mid-century.

Canada, Europe and Australia follow suit with their own immigrant numbers measuring into the hundreds of thousands.

One look at Minneapolis, Minnesota shows 120,000 African Somalian legal refugees now overwhelming welfare services

across that city. Yet, Somalia at 11.1 million in 2017, expects to reach 13.1 million within three years by 2020.

"The country is rapidly expanding with almost 3% annual population growth and a high fertility rate of 6.26 children per woman, which is the 4th highest in the world." (Source: United Nations.)

Similar scenarios occur in Sweden, Norway, Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany and Italy as to immigrants' onslaught.



## Part 2: Second Deadliest Birthrate Affecting All of Humanity: India

Part 2 of 6: India expects to jump from 1.252 billion to 1.55 billion within 32 years. It adds 16 million, net gain, annually. Today, Indians flood into America, Canada and Europe with chain-migration and added birth rates. Indians do not practice birth control. Their human misery index explodes off the charts. Let's take a look at what ramifications Western countries face from immigration from India.

In 1960, India reached 500,000,000 (million) people. Today, driven by multiple ancient religions that prohibit birth control, India suffers every kind of social and environmental consequence known to humanity with its 1.252 **billion** people. Even more catastrophic, it adds 16 million more people, net gain, annually.

India's major river, the Ganges, which I once rafted, flows into the ocean with the most polluted, toxic and contaminated waters known to humankind. It features trillions of gallons of untreated sewage, industrial waste, hundreds of chemicals and millions of pieces of plastics—that flow into the ocean 24/7. That watery, chemicalized conveyer belt creates a 20,000-square mile dead zone at the mouth of the Ganges. Once it hits the Indian Ocean, those contaminated waters spread all over the planet—poisoning marine life, avian life, reefs, the ocean floor and cause deadly acidification extensively around the planet.

Of note, the USA, China and India dump the most plastics into the world's oceans. Latest estimates show 5.25 trillion pieces of plastic float above and flow under the surface around the world—killing millions of marine creatures annually. As per investigations by marine biologist Julia Whitty, published in **OnEarth Magazine**, 46,000 pieces of plastic trash float on every square mile of Earth's oceans. In a word: sickening! Why? Because we've known this for 20 years, but no action to stop it by creating incentive-driven deposit-return laws internationally.

Within India, hundreds of millions of people lack a toilet. Therefore, they defecate-urinate on the land daily. In fact, the Indian Express reported, "Best experts tell us that 60.4 percent of Indians lack a toilet." As you can imagine, the stench in the cities, the filth in the streets and the total contamination of soils and rivers by that many people injecting their waste upon the lands and waters 24/7—cannot be comprehended.

Thus, every day of the year, 1,000 Indian children under the age of 12 die of dysentery, diarrhea and other waterborne diseases die from drinking contaminated water. (Source: www.populationmedia.org)

Yet, as India's population accelerates by 16 million net gain annually, they grow so fast, they cannot solve any of their problems. Disease and squalor top the "human misery index" beyond the concepts of the citizens from Western countries.

You can only imagine that India cannot support jobs, classrooms and housing for that many people added annually. Yet, not one word about population stabilization from India's leaders. If you look at the beauty of the Taj Mahal, one of the most famous landmarks of India, a short trip to the river next to it shows millions of pieces of plastic clogging its waters. And, the water features endless chemical poisons leaving it unfit for human or animal use.

In the cities, air pollution poisons the lungs of everyone breathing that toxic air 24/7. You see everyone tapping into electrical wires illegally at every juncture. You see filth, trash, and smell stench everywhere. When you see the traffic, it's a free-for-all that confounds and confuses the Western mind. The National

Nutritional Monitoring Bureau estimates that only 15 percent of Indians receive adequate nourishment daily.

As can be imagined, because of adding that 16 million more people annually, India's wilderness suffers encroachment via roads, housing, mining, lumbering and other development. Animal extinction rates soar in India. The Bengal Tiger and the Snow Leopard will not survive in the wilds within several decades. Elephants face an uncertain future. As a naïve, youthful world bicycle traveler back in 1984, I toured through China when it opened up to international visitors. You can imagine my joy—fulfilling my teenage dream to walk on the Great Wall of China.

But what really impacted me: wall-to-wall people. Every piece of land bloomed with crops. Every nook and cranny filled with people. They jammed every city. They overflowed every sector of that ancient land. Their plight stunned me. Today, they drive down 50 lane freeways and breathe toxic air along with horrifically polluted rivers like the Yangtze. That one visit changed my life by changing my perceptions concerning the end result of too many people.

At the time, Dr. Paul Ehrlich's **The Population Bomb**, described the horrific consequences of overpopulation. However, the mainstream media degraded him and his figures. Today, his figures play out on a world scale even more terrifying than when he wrote the book: 10 million children die of starvation annually. Another 8 million adults die of poverty and lack of food, annually. (Source: United Nations) Another 1.5-2.0 billion cannot secure clean drinking water. Billions live in what scientists call "The Human Misery Index". Hopeless, helpless and no way to change it!

Unfortunately, all of Ehrlich's detractors never visited India or China. Their worldviews stemmed from their limited experiences in America, Canada or Europe. They echoed the famed economist Julian Simon's boasts that this planet housed enough resources for 10,000 years of unlimited numbers of humans. Dr. Albert Bartlett, University of Colorado, named him an "innumerate" or mathematically illiterate.

Later, economist Kenneth Boulding, University of Colorado, stated, "Anyone who thinks we can continue population expansion is either an economist or a madman."

All the while, humans add another 80 million, net gain, of themselves to this planet, annually. Even with one child per woman birthrates in China for over 35 years, because of "population momentum" (so many women birthing one child), China adds 8,000,000 (million) annually.

While China continues its human numbers explosion, it degrades its quality of life and standard of living to levels beyond our understanding. China forges toward endless concrete jungles for cities, vanishing wilderness that creates severe animal extinction rates and a complete breakdown of ecology as to air, water and soil.

It constructs one new coal-fired electrical plant every week of the year. It adds 27,000,000 (million) new cars, net gain, annually according to an NBC Nightly News report with Lester Holt. It offers 50 lanes one way of traffic. It suffers under toxic air pollution so severe that lung cancer rates explode in big cities like Shanghai and Beijing.

While the world burns 94 million barrels of oil 24/7 in 2018, experts predict that China expects to burn 98 million barrels of oil annually by 2030—a scant 12 years from now. (Source: The Long Emergency by James Howard Kunstler) While everyone wants to drop the 'carbon footprint' from fossil fuel exhaust, all the efforts of <a href="www.350.org">www.350.org</a> equate to a total waste of time. Meanwhile, all of humanity faces "catastrophic climate destabilization" such as what happened in New Orleans and Baton Rouge this month. Additionally, Katrina, Sandy, Harvey and Haiyan in the Philippines. It's only going to worsen as we destabilize Earth's biosphere with our carbon emissions.

All that carbon exhaust suffocates the oceans as they "ingest" all that waste dumped into our biosphere. Results vary from "acidified" oceans where the normal PH balance no longer exists. Thus, phyto-planktons that create 80 percent of our oxygen supply

"The cheap oil age created an artificial bubble of plentitude for a period not much longer than a human lifetime....so I hazard to assert that as oil ceases to be cheap and the world reserves move toward depletion, we will be left with an enormous population...that the ecology of the earth will not support. The journey back toward non-oil population homeostasis will not be pretty. We will discover the hard way that population hyper growth was simply a side-effect of the oil age. It was a condition, not a problem with a solution. That is what happened and we are stuck with it." James Howard Kunstler, The Long Emergency

If the energy crisis doesn't impact China, water shortages most certainly will:

### By 2020 the water issue affects 30-40% of the world

"It's a huge problem that the electricity sector does not even realize how much water they actually consume. And together with the fact that we do not have unlimited water resources, it could lead to a serious crisis if nobody acts on it soon," says Professor Benjamin, Sovacool from Aarhus University.

When you include the agricultural sector with vanishing ground water, a "Perfect Storm" builds throughout China and India.

As to China's rivers, they run in raw sewage, hundreds if not

thousands of chemicals and more toxic waste than anyone comprehends. The Yangtze River dumps trillions of gallons of lethal waste into the oceans 24/7. It features an astounding 20,000 square mile 'dead zone' at its mouth. That means most vertebrate marine creatures cannot live within those toxic waters. Dozens of such poisoned rivers flow into the ocean from China. Nonetheless, those toxic waters flow around the world to poison marine habitats everywhere.

You cannot comprehend China's ordeal unless you visited that ancient civilization. It's out of control of itself. I'm only touching the surface of China's predicament. But the Chinese show exceptional intelligence in escaping to first world countries. Today, Chinese immigrants take over Vancouver, British Columbia in Canada. They buy land and buildings. Chinese dictate to the Canadians as they take over schools and local governments. They chain-migrate their families into Canada. Entire cities on America's West Coast house only Chinese, speak only Chinese and hold allegiance only to China. They also continue massive chain-migration into America. Chinese money buys farmlands in Asia and in South America. China's people compete to move to Canada, Australia, Europe and America. As you can see, no one will escape the ramifications of the next added 3,000,000,000 (billion) people to this globe. No one will escape the implications of adding 138,000,000 (million) more people to America within 32 years. You may expect those consequences to invade your state, your community and your family.

Remember this: developing countries' citizens will not stop their birth rates significantly enough to stop overloading their countries. Therefore, they will contribute to the 3.0 billion added, hungry and desperate refugees looking for a country to land.

In 2018, the United Nations estimates that 60,000,000 (million) refugees lack water, food, energy and homes, and look toward first world countries to migrate. Their numbers will grow to 150,000,000 to as high as 200,000,000 (million) refugees by 2050—a scant 32 years from now.

### What Western Countries Face with Refugee Armada

Canada houses 36,000,000 (million) people in 2018. Because of mass immigration, they expect 41.1 million by 2050. To give you

an idea of Canada's dilemma, let's look at the numbers. We know Canada as a "big" little country. That means it's "big" in landmass but lacks ample arable land to grow crops. While its citizens chose 2.0 birth rates since 1970, its leaders forced massive immigration onto Canada. It faces food shortages, environmental breakdown, accelerating carbon footprint damage, species extinctions and lowered quality of life.

Europe houses 742.5 million people in 2018. It encompasses 3.9 million square miles. Not much bigger than the United States at 3.1 million square miles. The United Kingdom houses 65.6 million people in a landmass less than the size of Oregon. Oregon features 4.0 million people. Germany at 82 million holds less land than the state of New Mexico. That state holds 1.8 million. The tiny country of France holds 66 million people. While Europe faces tremendous overcrowding today, it faces mass immigration overrunning every border of all of its countries from Middle Eastern and African population overload.

Australia holds 24 million in 2018, but expects to reach 38 to 48 million by mid-century via mass immigration. Over 90 percent of Australia features desert. It lacks water and arable land, but powerful developer interests force immigration onto that desert continent as if tomorrow never arrives. Melbourne and Sydney strangle themselves with immigrants.

As you can imagine, immigration solves nothing. It stalls the inevitable for every Western country: ultimate collapse from overloading carrying capacity of every receiving country.

In a final note as to the rest of the world adding that 3,000,000,000 new humans to the planet by 2050---it's not JUST Africa, India and China.

Mexico in 2018 cannot feed, work or house its people. It features horrific sewage systems exhausting into the ocean. It grows from 114 million to as high as 135 million by 2050. All of South America continues from 426 million to 535 million by 2050. They cut and burn their Amazon rainforests at 1.5 acres every second.

Here's a kicker: Bangladesh features an area less than the size of the U.S. State of Iowa, but houses 163 million people. The United Nations projects Bangladesh will reach 201 million people by 2050. (Source for population figures: United Nations Population Projections)

Can enough activists in Western countries be created out of a series like this to create a movement to stop mass immigration into Western countries? Goal: Western countries need a national discussion-debate on the future of their civilizations. It's not going to happen by itself. That discussion-debate begins with you.
